Next year, the high school will be doing "block scheduling".


If you are going to take one of the classes on the left, you can:

Year-Long Elective

World Language



- High School students are required to take 2 years of World Language to meet the Michigan Merit Curriculum requirements for graduation from high-school.
- Currently we offer: Spanish I, French I or German I (1 section at AHS 1sthour)
- **▶** We will also have a Spanish I class for Spanish speakers
- ► Not a requirement to have had language prior to 8th grade.
- Many 8th grade students will begin their Foreign Language requirement in 8th grade that will count toward the 2 years you need to graduate, but you don't have to take it in 8th grad if you don't want to.

(Spanish for Spanish-speakers)




Do you already speak Spanish at home?

Sports and Music Culture





This class will be taught with access to different types of literature and discussions that empower our reluctant reading students to gain the skills they need to thrive in high school, college, and beyond. Sports and Music Culture curriculum has middle school pathways in reading, short writings, and argumentative/persuasive debates and essays. We can expose students to multiple types of texts like, but not limited to, blogging, journalism, short stories, and poetry to prepare them for high school and beyond. Our current AMS English curriculum gives students experiences in each of these areas, but may have moved beyond the abilities of some of our vulnerable students who have not found their voice yet. This class will allow them to discuss and write about a topic that they are passionate about at the pace they need.





<u>Art 8</u>

Emphasis will be on:

- Art history and appreciation
- Using various media such as pencils, inks, pastels, clay and paper mache.
- Drawing and painting
- Sculpture and clay

May be able to take more than 1 semester of Art.

Environmental Science

A new middle school environmental science elective



The purpose of this course is to teach students to:

- identify human activities that are responsible for causing current climate change, and
 - what actions communities can take to mitigate the effects of global climate change.

8th grade Leadership

Find your cause and help others—in the school or in the community

 MUST BE able to work independently and be self-motivated with a heart that's willing to help others!

In Leadership class, you plan and carry out service project ideas to help make the world a better place.

Examples: Canned food drive, volleyball/dodgeball tournaments to help raise money for charity, clothing drives, etc.





Multi-Media



This class will explore the world of film and video editing. Students will learn about filming techniques and the most effective way to tell a story in film. They will also receive comprehensive training in Adobe Premiere video editing software and Sound booth sound editing software. They will then use what they have learned to create how-to videos and a video com

PE 8

Boys and girls participating in 8th grade PE will be challenged with a variety of fitness conditioning activities that will increase their muscular strength and endurance, flexibility, and cardiovascular endurance. Students will develop skills to be used to play a variety of team sports along with a basic understanding of team sport rules. Indoor and outdoor activities include; basketball, volleyball, soccer, speedball, floor hockey, softball and group games. Students will participate in fitness testing. Sportsmanship, teamwork and leadership are emphasized.

MAY be possible to take more than 1 PE.

STEM—These are 2 separate semester courses:

STEM 8 Medical Detectives-Semester 1

In Medical Detectives, students will discover how health care professionals act as medical detectives to identify, treat and prevent illness in their patients. Students investigate body systems and how this information is processed. Medical Detectives analyze patients and data in a community outbreak simulations. Students use observation and investigation skills learned throughout the course to solve the outbreak diagnosis for the community and report their findings.

STEM 8 Green Architecture-Semester 2

Today's students have grown up in an age of "green" choices. In the Green Architecture unit, students learn how to apply this concept to the fields of architecture and construction by exploring dimensioning, measuring, and architectural sustainability as they design using 2D and 3D computer modelling. Students will conclude the course by building 3D models of their designs.



Science



Advanced Math-Algebra I

- Students who are currently enrolled in <u>Advanced Math 7</u> will automatically go on to Algebra I next year (unless the teacher feels you aren't ready based on poor grades and work habits).
- Students who wish to take a placement test can discuss their wishes with their current math teacher.
- Math teachers will notify Ms. Amico if the interested students should take the placement test in August.
- Those students interested in AP math testing should have a minimum score of 70% or better on most recent NWEA and score of 232 or higher along with your teachers recommendation.
- Recommended students will get a testing date for August and study materials prior to the last day of school this year.

Advanced English 8

Placement criteria-

*Current Adv Eng 7 students should discuss their interest in continuing next year with Mrs. Nofs. She will give Ms.

Amico a list of current students who should continue in grade 8.

If you have a B or better and want to continue, please check this option off on your purple sheet.

Other qualified (new) candidates will be invited to take a placement test based on:

- 7th grade teacher recommendation (Must have good work habits, motivation, desire for advanced placement and good attendance).
- There WILL be a lot of required reading in this course!
- B or better in Regular English 7
- Standardized Test scores --70% or better and a score of 225 or higher on the NWEA.
- Placement test will be offered in April by invitation only.

Once you accept the invitation to be in Advanced English 8, you will NOT be able to switch out mid-year next year so please understand this is a big commitment!

NWEA and Report Card Grades Why do they matter?

*The counselors use the data from your NWEA testing (along with your most recent grades) in 7th grade to determine if you need extra help in reading (ELA Lab), math (Math Lab) or all classes (AC).

*If you meet the criteria, we will substitute a semester elective for a reading or math lab class.

*DO YOUR BEST on the NWEA assessments and report card grades!
